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2 Introduction

Young Professional Development Society Nepal (YPDSN) is an independent, non-governmental and non-profitable social organization established by a group of like-minded youths with experiences in different sectors to promote youth capacity development and provide opportunities to youths. It is registered with District Administrative Office as non for-profit social organization with the registration number is 414-070-71. It is also affiliated with Social Welfare Council with the affiliation number 38571 and Tax payer office number 601602555. YPDSN is involved in different areas of work such as youth professionalism, youth development and capacity building, health, education, research, environment & Climate Change, youth and women empowerment and Social and Economic Advancement. We promote and secure vulnerable and marginalized youths through development of professionalism and providing them with opportunities and make them initiative & capable with result-oriented research & programmes.

YPDSN aspires to improve the living conditions of the poor and marginalized groups by adopting strategies through community initiative, participation and sensitization. It is founded in 2013 and its main working field is Kathmandu Valley. if necessary, it can conduct any program out of the Kathmandu Valley. Hence, it has been also working among backward communities in the interior unreached pockets in the coast of Nepal. Women self-support groups have been taken as the base for all interventions and SDGs activities enabling them to contribute towards the mainstream of development process. It has had partnership with national and international organizations like International Federation of Youth Foundation (IFY), Erasmus plus project partners New Horizons-Italy, Fundacja Active Kids Foundation - Poland, ASSOCIAZIONE SOS EUROPA - Italy, Global Network of Sex Worker Project (NSWP), UK, Global Alliance of Civil Society Organizations (CIVICUS), South Africa, Development Aid, Cyprus, Youth Center to Act for National (YOUCAN), INDONESIA, Kanti Cultural Center (KCC), Kathmandu and so on. Likewise, it has already worked with international organizations in youth entrepreneurship, school health and hygiene, school teaching Programme, reproductive health in schools etc.

YPDSN comprises of diverse and dynamic group of competent young people from different background. YPDSN has 7 executive members with 3 female members. Each member of YPDSN has specific qualities that has helped to sustain and run the organization. From health to management, nursing to administration, social sciences and information technology, the team comprises of diverse groups and the key members of the team are well-equipped with skills in writing grant proposals and applications, planning, implementation and monitoring of programs, report writing, research and M&E, coordination & management and innovations and application of technology.

2.1 Mission

To make today's young future leader, promote young generation & professional quality, ensure sustainable and build up inclusive social development for improved quality of life for all.

2.2 Aim

Our main aim is to provide youth professional skill, development and learning opportunity for poor and excluded society generation focus to strengthen them. We plan to achieve our aim by developing, testing and delivering evidence-based, feasible and cost-effective intervention relating to professional and social development with greater involvement of youth Programme, and communities. We support the government initiative aimed at poverty reduction in line with the sustainable development goals and targets.

3 Organization's Objectives

The main objective is to contribute young generation professional development, implementation and scale up of evidence-based and cost-effective intervention in young professional and social sector. The specific objectives are:

- To gain a greater understanding of professional development issues and explore possible solutions through quality research and development keeping the focus on youths;
- To promote quality research and research communications towards development of evidence-based policy and practice in the field of youth;
- To review and analyze the policies and programmes effectiveness at local, and national level and understand their implications in professional services and social development;
- To ensure functional linkage and collaboration among policy makers, Programme managers, researchers, social scientists, and institutions with similar objectives with a view to the institutionalization of Programme-based operational research in youth programmes;
- To enhance access to information on young generation and social development sector to policy makers and practitioners;
- To involve youths in the field of health, education, environment and economic activities and programs
- To support government initiative in the field of youth involvement, youth development and youth related policies

4 Scope of work and target

Young Professional Development Society Nepal (YPDSN) is an independent, non-profitable non-governmental organization (NGOs). It is mainly concerned with implementing non-profitable social work in the field of youth, women, education, health, environment and economic development. We focus on providing opportunities and involvement of young generation and development of professionalism for creativity, community enhancement and development and prosperity.

Basically, YPDSN will function in research and development of social issue. Youth Professionalism & Involvement in agriculture, Natural Resource Conservation & Climate Change, Women Empowerment, Social and Economic Advancement, Primary Health & Education and so on. We promote and secure vulnerable group and exclude society generation life by professionalism. We also provide opportunity to those people who are looking for professionalism. We make them initiative & capable with result-oriented research & Programme.

5 Working modalities

YPDSN will be working youth development Programme by implementing organization collaboration with the country government. We work in collaboration with the Government, I/NGOs and community groups as relevant. Moreover, we collaborate with local governance, private professional development, care providers and teaching institutions, young professional organization and corporate sectors for the effective implementation of its programmes.

Our current practices of implementing programs and activities include getting approval from the concerned government agencies (Social Welfare Council). After the approval, induction meeting is conducted with all relevant stakeholders and partners to inform and communicate about the programs. Likewise, communication and coordination are done with local level stakeholders and local partners. Only after approval and coordination with all stakeholders, the program/activities are implemented in the concerned areas. After the program implementation, program evaluation and feedback are collected. Necessary reporting is conducted to the concerned agencies and the program comes to the end in the closure phase.



Currently, YPDSN is working in coordination and partnership with the following government and non-government stakeholders and will continue to engage the stakeholders as follows:

Coordination with Government of Nepal (Ministry of Youth and Sports): At the policy level, YPDSN is coordinating with the ministry of youth and sports. All the youth related policies, strategies, directives and plans are governed through the ministry. Hence, the ministry of youth and sports is the key stakeholder for the project. YPDSN shall involve the ministry from the inception of the program and communicate with the ministry on all relevant issues and the progress of the project. Regular meetings will be conducted with the official of the ministry and also the participants/focal person from the ministry will be invited in different programs and activities. The ministry will also play the role in monitoring and supervision of the project activities.

Coordination with National Youth Council (NYC), Nepal: NYC believes that youth are the most active, energetic and dynamic group, which is considered the agent of political, economic and social changes in any countries and its vision is to making the Nepalese youth strong, competent, competitive and self-reliant, to build a modern, just and affluent Nepal through their meaningful participation and promotion of their leadership capacity. Hence, YPDSN will coordinate with NYC for all aspects of the program implementation and monitoring. The representatives of NYC will be invited in all the relevant activities for their meaningful participation. Also, regular meetings will be held with NYC.

Youth-serving organizations: Nepal has a relatively large network of youth serving organizations; however, the vast majority is only province or local in scope. A larger local and international NGOs are active in Nepal that are working in the field of sexual and reproductive health. Hence, YPDSN will initiate mapping of youth related organizations and involve them in the program as and when necessary. Among all, the local youth related organizations will be focused. Their organizational capacity will be developed.

Local government bodies and health authorities: YPDSN has been coordinating with local government bodies such as municipalities and wards. The concerned responsible authorities are informed about the program and the activities conducted accordingly. Likewise, different health institutions are also involved in health related programs. The health post and primary health care centres are also involved in all relevant programs.

YPDSN will continue to coordinate and partnership with all relevant government (central, provincial and local) as well as non-governmental organizations for implementation of the programs.

6 Geographical coverage

YPDSN is registered in Kathmandu but has the approval to conduct the programs and activities in all 77 districts of Nepal. Thus, YPDSN is able to conduct activities along with its network and partners in all 7 provinces & 77districts. We work across the nation to implement the different research projects and youth professional development programme. We will be implementing different activities to support GoN in Nepal. The direct implementation of this organization is also programme-based activity, operational research, young professional capacity building and to strengthen them.

YPDSN has working partners in Sudupaschim province which is NAPID Nepal. National Partnership for Integrated Development –Nepal (NAPID- Nepal) is a Non-profit service based, National Non-government organization, registered in district administration office Kanchanpur and affiliation with social Welfare council Kathmandu and working in the field of health and human right. NAPID NEPAL has been working in Kanchanpur and Kailali district since 2062 BS to fulfill its vision and mission by empowering and ensuring the integrated social rights of people. NAPID –NEPAL is implementing Regional Level Drugs Resistant TB Treatment Center and DR-TB Hostel in Joint Collaboration with Save the children, National TB center, Far-western Provincial Health Directorate- Dipayal, Seti Zonal Hospital- Dhangadhi and Health Office, Kailali.

Also, YPDSN has a network of individuals and youth related organizations in different provinces and districts of the county. To implement any programs in the districts, YPDSN has the capacity to engage and mobilize individual as well as the organizational networks to implement the programs. Many programs have been conducted in similar manner in the past and hence we would continue the similar modality in implementing activities across different districts.

7 Major Working Areas

The major working areas of Young Professional Development Society Nepal (YPDSN) is diverse. The areas of work will bring about the different programmes and projects for youth professionalism. Also, it will help them in upliftment of their life standard. Similarly, it will help them identify their interested fields and motivate to engage in different sectors. Therefore, youth can contribute to holistic development of the nation. The government policy also inspires Youths towards entrepreneurship and advancement of science & technology. Consequently, they become initiative & enthusiastic to create a perfect society & the nation as expected. In this respect, we believe this organization can play a crucial role in nation-building as well and finally succeeds to achieve its goals.

8 Major Activities Completed and Achievements

YPDSN had been mainly conducting activities in the field of youth development and empowerment as well as social development. The major activities that YPDSN has completed are: Global Heroes Program, an international youth exchange program that aimed to develop

skills among youths for leadership and community service. Apart from this, YPDSN has been actively engaging in regular programs such as health camps, blood donation and awareness programs. It collaborates with the relevant stakeholders in conducting such programs/activities. Similarly, there is another area, where it gets involved in school health programs, and it provided entrepreneurial skill and knowledge as well as awareness to school children on various health related topics like sanitation, personal hygiene, HIV, Drug Addiction, reproductive health, sex education etc. In the beginning of 2020, YPDSN was involved in providing Tuberculosis training to health care workers of refugees community.

Young Professional Development Society Nepal (YPDSN) has also been involved in different health programs and TB is one of the major working areas. YPDSN has been working with Snow Lion Foundation (SLF) for TB management among Tibetan Refugees in Nepal, in the areas of capacity development of health workers, screening of TB among refugees, referral and linkages for treatment, care and support as required. YPDSN in coordination with SLF is conducting regular TB screening camps among refugees in their settlements as well as in schools, where screening, sputum collection, diagnosis, referral and treatment is being conducted. YPDSN supports in identifying and management of TB cases among Tibetan refugees in Nepal. YPDSN has been working with Snow Lion Foundation (SLF) for TB management among Tibetan Refugees in Nepal. YPDSN in coordination with SLF is conducting regular TB screening camps among refugees in their settlements as well as in schools, where screening, sputum collection, diagnosis, referral and treatment is being conducted. YPDSN supports in identifying and management of TB cases among Tibetan refugees in Nepal.

One of my major working areas is reproductive health and we aim to implement programs related to youth reproductive health in Nepal. In the context of the importance of reproductive health among youths, we plan to work in the different components of reproductive health: Family Planning, Adolescent Sexual and Reproductive Health, Infertility, Reproductive Tract Infection/Sexually Transmitted Infections and HIV/AIDS, Neonatal Care, Maternal Care, Elderly Care and Gender-Based Violence. In addition, YPDSN is also interested in activities related to Reproductive and Sexual Rights, and Ethical Issues and Reproductive Health Policies, Strategies and Evaluation.

The details of the major activities completed by YPDSN are described below:

YSEEAM: Youth Social Entrepreneurship Education for All with Moodle

YSEEAM takes roots on the threshold of an approaching Fourth Industrial Revolution in which automation and massive digitalization is predicted to radically alter the status-quo relation between trainers- trainees, youth workers - youths and their place in the learning process; as well as the future's changeable Skills Demand. Entrepreneurship - Analytical thinking - Leadership and Social Influence are predicted by World Economic Forum (2018) to continue to be most essential skills for future jobs. In the face of those challenges, youth work shall need to anticipate trends and adapt to new technological changes in order to confirm its indispensable role in the new digital age.

OBJECTIVE: The project aims to consolidate the role of youth workers in promoting youth social entrepreneurship by enriching them with the core knowledge of social entrepreneurship, youth work skills, and particularly the technical know-how to open their relevant courses on MOODLE as a new, innovative, far-reaching way of doing youth work. Simultaneously, YSEEAM aspires to develop a new form of youth work methods in the efforts to make its digital shift.

MAIN ACTIVITIES AND RESULTS: Towards the above goal, YSEEAM plans a series of interlinking CB and Motilities activities within 24 months that shall result in the production of 07

Mini-Moodle Courses in all project countries, a final Full Moodle Course of the project, and the project Handbook "Moodling Youth Work" detailing how to use Moodle to do Youth Work.

PARTNERSHIP: Taking into account the inherent global factor of entrepreneurship and digital learning, YSEEAM consortium brings together 7 partners from three continents for wider and enriching realities and viewpoints. There will be 3 partners from Europe (Italy- Coordinator, Denmark and Greece), 2 partners from Asia (Indonesia and Nepal), and 2 partners from Africa (Ghana and South Africa).

IMPACT: - On their competences: enhanced entrepreneurial knowledge and relevant youth work skills (lab-styled learning, digital youth work).

It enabled young people to feel abroad and contribute to the world and exchange their talents and skills by work in team on Nepal social project. We, the team of YPDSN, implemented the program effectively and efficiently in collaboration with YOUCAN INDONESIA.

Similarly, it will expand youths' limits and will challenge them to get out of their comfort zone, and engage in in short-term volunteer programmes on small micro-economic, healthcare, and human development. Also, it will change the way the youth see and understand the world. Likewise, it will launch social empowerment Programme to develop economy, education and public health of rural areas. Even, it will enhance the capacity of entrepreneurship along with youth's skills and knowledge

Young Sociopreneurship Leaders Exchange

The Young Sociopreneurship Leaders Exchange 2019 Nepal (YSLE) is an international effort, involving emerging youth professionals from Asia Pacific countries, to focus research efforts in both the sciences and social sciences on the world's South & Pacific Regions. In order to secure youth involvement in all aspects of the, well formed, aiming specifically to network young student from all backgrounds to enable collaboration and to involve this group in outreach focused towards other young people. To help fulfill this mandate, the YSLE has developed the concept of the International Youth exchange program on Nepal & Indonesia. This program will bring together youth from a diverse set of backgrounds and nationalities to discuss the issues affecting Indonesia, their effects on a global scale and ways of addressing these issues. The program will also serve to highlight ongoing YESTD/YPDSN and IYOIN program, especially research being undertaken by youth.

Participants will see the value of program in fields very different from their own and how this work may be applicable to their own studies. Young students will have the opportunity to talk to youth living in the Asia/Nepal and learn from them the best approaches to working in communities. Young people working in community and issue will have the opportunity to interact, allowing policy workers to emphasize the need for policy relevant documents coming from the research community. Ultimately, these interactions will contribute to the next generation of YSLE researchers, policy makers and leaders being well-equipped and more willing to work together and across disciplines that have been the case in the past. This will hopefully allow them to better address some of the issues faced by the Asian Regions.

Goal of the program: The main goal of the program is to develop capacity of youths on leadership, social entrepreneurship, Tourism development, cultural exchange and rural education system of Nepal. To meet the goal of the program, the following objectives have been put forward.

The Objectives of the program are:

- 1) To engage participants in exchange program with different youth groups and youth led organizations
- 2) To facilitate leadership development among participants through collaboration with various groups
- 3) To involve and visit to various sites with cultural importance within the country
- 4) To understand the rural education system in Nepal through site visits and interactions
- 5) To understand the tourism status of Nepal and its impact on economy

We acknowledge that Young Professional Development Society Nepal (YPDSN) have been conducting various Youth Programme in collaboration with Kanti Cultural Center (KCC) and external development partners in previous years in different sectors such health camps and Global Heroes – Youth Entrepreneurship development.

Adolescence Sexual and Reproductive Health Programs

YPDSN has been involved in orientation and training programs related to adolescence sexual and reproductive health programs in different schools and colleges. The main objectives of the program are to increase awareness and understanding about sexual and reproductive

health among school students. Different orientation programs have been conducted in coordination with the schools.

9 Working Partners

NEW HORIZONS - ITALY
