## ABOUT IEC AUSTRIA

	The Innovative Education Center (IEC Austria) was established in Vienna in 2018 by a group of experienced youth workers and international consultants. The aim of IEC Austria team is to develop projects, training courses and non-formal learning activities to support and improve the use of sport, music and art, as a tool for healthy life, active citizenship, empowerment, social inclusion, mutual understanding, entrepreneurial development, and leadership.
	Throughout the years, IEC Austria has built a strong network with associations in different sectors, schools, and social enterprises which created various placement and volunteering opportunities for young people living in Austria. IEC Austria puts special interest in the empowerment of disadvantaged groups in society such as migrants, women and young people with geographical, social and economic disadvantages. In order to attain this goal, IEC's members have been collaborating with NGOs, IFIs and governments and have worked on various projects funded by European Commission and UN in recent years.
Description of the organisation	Every year about 100 learners are involved in over 15 local learning activities - training courses, seminars, workshops and sport events. Local learning activities are organized for many different target groups, including adult learners, youth (16-29), NEETs, teachers, university professors, social activists and other professionals.
	In a very short time of period, the association grew from a small-scale NGO to an organization with permanent staff, a network of volunteers. IEC Austria has two main fields: <b>education and sports.</b>
	<b>Education programs</b> are developed by a highly qualified team who has expertise in regenerative and sustainable living, creative ecology, archeology and museology, research, art and system science, communication, videography and animation, behavior science, architecture, gastronomy, pre-childhood development, adaptive leadership, entrepreneurship, circular economy, biodiversity, climate change, nature conservation and protection, gamification, engineering and industry 5.0 and 6.0, coastal and ocean engineering, and etc.
	<b>Sport programs</b> are focused on education in and through sports priority of European Commission. IEC has been running many sport projects where hiking and mountaineering, snow shoe, cycling, mountain biking and women's football are used as a tool for education and social inclusion.



	IEC has a wide network composed of universities, civil society organizations, sport associations and clubs and regional and local government and has more than 60 volunteers.
	IEC Austria is member of networks: Break Free From Plastic movement - global movement envisioning a future free from plastic pollution. Our common goal is to bring systemic change through a holistic approach tackling plastic pollution across the whole plastics value chain, focusing on prevention rather than cure, and providing effective solutions.

activities and experience of the organisation in the areas relevant for this application?	IEC Austria is implementing a project aiming to empower the citizens, with a focus on the ones in rural areas (Europe for Citizens project CORE - Citizens Occupy Rural Europe). CORE aim is to make citizens feel closer and as they belong to Europe by giving them tools and promoting active participation. By creating an empowerment opportunity for youngsters and decreasing their isolation feeling, youth from rural areas feel involved in a community where they can participate, be active and have a role for the empowerment of other peers. Through the project activities IEC Austria motivates young citizens and improves their opportunities and develops empowerment of young Europeans.
	Social inclusion through education and sport
	IEC Austria is coordinating sport small collaborative partnership project Hike Together, aiming to raise awareness of the importance of health benefits of physical activity



through walking in nature – as a natural exercise through increased participation in hiking and trekking. Project is focused on young people from disadvantaged backgrounds, promoting hiking and walking in nature using hiking as a tool for social inclusion of young people from disadvantage background and promotion of equal opportunities and bringing together people, regardless of their age, sex, origin, financial status, etc. IEC Austria contributes to increase women's active participation in sports, break down gender stereotypes and bring to the conclusion that there are no male or female sports, but everyone should feel free to follow his own aspirations, feeling free from conditioning. In order to achieve the project's objectives, IEC Austria organizes a sports competition between 12 football teams mixed both from gender and nationality, this event is be a moment of meeting and confrontation between boys and girls from the partner countries.

#### Promoting sport and physical activity

IEC Austria is a partner of Erasmus+ sport Collaborative partnership - Eco-friendly Sports aiming to empower youth on becoming knowledgeable and skilled on sustainability and nature conservation topics, on the way to become active citizens promoting these issues in their life by creating valuable interactions with the sport sector. Through Eco-friendly sports project activities, we are developing new methods of environmental education through sport activities in natural areas provide invaluable opportunities in the urban lifestyle to keep people's physical and mental health and to significantly decrease the stress levels. This way IEC Austria improves knowledge and experience of representatives of sport clubs and youth workers about the concept of eco-sports. By inviting citizens to participate in activities such as plogging, herbal hiking, nature clean-ups, IEC Austria also encourages them to take action towards a better environment and building a society which feels close and attached to nature will contribute to using natural resources sustainably and thus building sustainable cities. IEC Austria encourages participation in sport and physical activity in nature, especially by supporting the implementation of European Union (EU) policy documents in the field of sport and other relevant policy areas such as recommendations, guidelines, policy strategies, and the implementation of the Council Recommendation on healthenhancing physical activity (HEPA).

#### Sustainability, nature conservation and environmental protection

IEC Austria is implementing Erasmus+ mobility for youth workers called Touch (the) nature. Training course aim is to provide tools for youth workers about How to design an outdoor program for youth. Training course includes topics such as introduction to what is experiential pedagogy and how to use it in youth work and importance of motivating youth to spend time in nature and how to motivate the youngsters. IEC Austria promotes the use of bicycles and develops exercise habits for healthy living in the participants and the local community and especially encouraging cycling in school and work commutes. The aim is to develop an attitude towards environmental and climate change as well as the development of healthy living alternatives.

#### Work with local community in Austria

We organize "International hike" by Vienna hikers in the natural area around Vienna, where locals from Austria and migrants from all over the world, studying and living in Vienna meet. Hike takes 3-6 hours and ends with a common picnic organized by IEC Austria. The aim of the regular hiking is to promote sport and physical activities in natural area that not only contribute to better health, but also have a positive impact on the environment. Hiking itself is promoting social inclusion by not giving barriers to



	participation in the physical activity. Our hikes are combined with enviro actions such as plogging, herbal hiking, eco-friendly triathlon on the river bank of Danube or in the parks (and before or after clean-up events), planting trees, building birdhouses and many more.
