







Uhat's Our Purpose?



Where to visit in Ankara?



Kocatepe Mosque



Where to visit in Ankara?



Anıtkabir

Anitkabir is situated on a majestic hill in the Anittepe neighborhood. It is the final resting place of Mustafa Kemal Atatürk, the founder of the Republic of Turkey. Inside Anitkabir, you can explore the Museum of Ataturk and the War of Independence. The museum showcases a large collection of items related to Atatürk, such as personal belongings and historical artifacts. It also has a section dedicated to the War of Independence, offering panoramic views of the battlefields.



Atakule Tower

One of the highest structures of the city, with a shopping mall located under the tower. It is an observation tower, located in the Çankaya district. Also one of the primary landmarks of the city. As the district of Çankaya is itself on a hill, the tower can be spotted from almost anywhere in the city during clear days.

The Lake of Eymir

Eymir Lake is located within the borders of Gölbaşı province. It's among the ideal spots for those who wish to make a daily visit, with its natural beauty, restaurants by the lakes and clean air. Eymir with its beautiful lakeside view and wildlife is also suitable for hiking and bicycle touring.



The Castle of Ankara




How to Reach the Center?

To reach the city center from Ankara Esenboğa Airport, you can take the BELKO AIR bus heading towards KIZILAY. Get off the bus at Güvenpark (Kızılay) stop. A one-way bus ticket to the city center costs 37.00 Turkish Liras (€1.34).

The journey typically takes around 50 minutes.
